

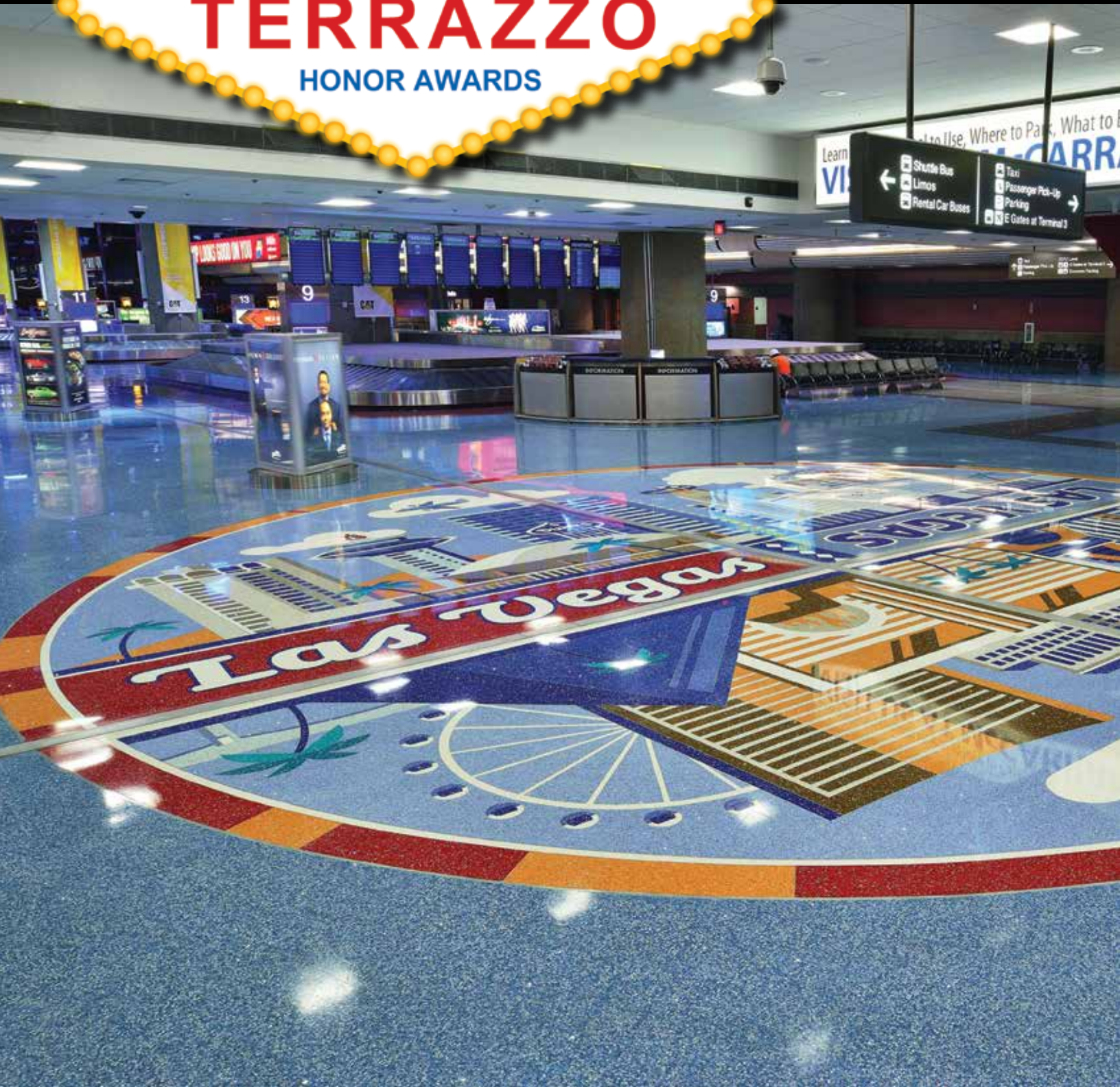

## ***Clover Middle School*** ***Clover, SC***

A simplified DNA helix leads the design of this 47,500-square-foot epoxy terrazzo installation in six colors. Framed by a splitting DNA helix, the central rotunda incorporates the new school's eagle mascot. Each wing of the school intercepts at the simplified helix to introduce a new terrazzo color for wayfinding. Complex curves along its corridors connect the lobby and large multipurpose rooms, meeting in a collaboration space at the rear where the design echoes the curved accent ceiling.

## **Malcolm X College** **Chicago, IL**

Form and function come together in this 110,000-square-foot installation of epoxy terrazzo in a new eight-story, 500,000-square-foot healthcare education facility. A crisp, clean, classic look was achieved within long hallways and a monumental staircase, all in a muted two-tone color scheme with sparkling mother-of-pearl and mirror aggregate. The floor design lent itself to definition of spaces within the structure, providing a neutral backdrop to the other architectural elements.

## ***Statewide Library Archives Museum (SLAM)*** ***Juneau, AK***

The centerpiece of this 10,000-square-foot epoxy terrazzo installation is the detailed and accurately scaled state map located in the lobby. The three contrasting colors all incorporate 100 percent recycled concrete aggregate, resulting in warm, earthy tones and texture. Zinc and brass divider strips were selected to form the intricate shoreline and highlight specific features on the map. To support a radiant heat system in the slab, expansion joints were introduced into the terrazzo. The expansion joints were placed so as to not detract from the intent of the design.

## ***Norfolk International Airport*** ***Norfolk, VA***

Evoking a maritime theme, the focal point of this 70,000-square-foot epoxy renovation is the detailed astrolabe quadrant feature on the concourse floor, echoed by over two dozen other astrolabe features and formed in aluminum and zinc divider strips. Arcs radiate down the concourse and fluid lines, bearing out the water theme, reinforce traffic patterns. A simpler staggered accent band pattern adds movement, all in rich, simple neutrals.

## Michigan State University Lansing, MI

This eye-catching installation in a 130,000-square-foot new bio-engineering facility incorporates 10,000 square feet of epoxy terrazzo, setting the scene for interdisciplinary collaboration and innovation. Its serendipitous, scientific starburst node pattern in five sizes, reiterated throughout, is purposefully unpredictable within the subdued, modern two-color palette. The staircase, consisting of 168 sections of pre-cast terrazzo tread-and-riser combinations, is the focal point of the inviting, open four-story atrium.

## ***INOVA Fairfax Women's Hospital*** ***Falls Church, VA***

This 18,000-square-foot, seven-color epoxy terrazzo floor is beautifully suited to a hospital environment and contributes to a cohesive design. Terrazzo was used in the lobby, concourse and café. The two stories are connected with a floating self-supported stair, complemented with a straight, flat terrazzo base. Challenges of the job included forging a seamless match of the new floor to a high-polish terrazzo floor previously installed, for an undetectable transition.

## ***Joliet Central High School Student Center Joliet, IL***

This inviting 6,000-square-foot atrium, serving as dining hall and meeting area, is built around the gothic limestone facade of the original 1901 school building. The 40-foot glass ceiling illuminates and modernizes the space while complementing the old exterior stone block and gargoyles, and showcasing a light trough built into the floor. The classic three-tone installation of epoxy terrazzo totals 10,000 square feet, including monumental floating precast terrazzo stairs on each side.

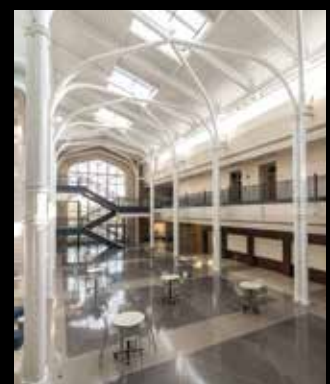

## Landmark Center Two Orlando, FL

This elegant corporate office space is home to a large architectural firm. The building was remodeled with 5,400 square feet of epoxy terrazzo in four subdued, rich colors. Mother-of-pearl and silver-coated mirror aggregate reflect the abundant natural light from the five-story window wall, reinforcing the airiness of the atrium. This sophisticated yet simple design with its concentric and intersecting circles create integrated wayfinding to key areas of the building.

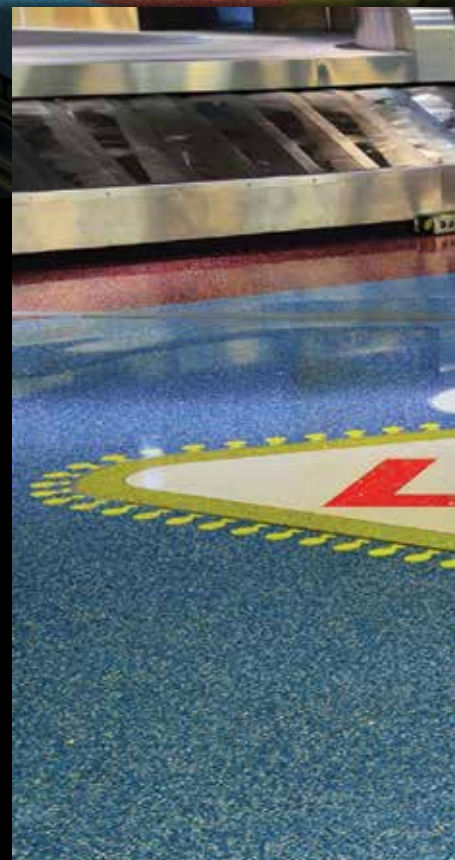
# 2017 JOB OF THE YEAR

## *McCarran International Airport - Terminal 1* *Baggage Claim & Ticketing* *Las Vegas, NV*

McCarran Airport in Las Vegas is a showcase for design detail and meticulous hand craftsmanship in terrazzo. A total of 240,000 square feet of epoxy terrazzo was installed to replace carpet and tile. Field colors were selected to complement existing finishes and provide a fully updated look to the terminal without a complete remodel. The assertive design of the new terrazzo floor perfectly captures the character of the city, while providing logical functionality. The 27 beautiful colors are consistently deep and rich, sparkling with mirror, glass and mother-of-pearl aggregate.

The 40-foot diameter medallion, containing 5,000 linear feet of one-eighth-inch zinc strip was installed within 1,200 square feet of terrazzo. All divider strip was hand-bent on-site. Precast terrazzo slabs were fabricated in-house and water-jet cut for extremely intricate designs.

With a border reminiscent of a poker chip, the medallion juxtaposes the city's historical skyline with present-day landmarks. The vintage skyline references iconic hotels of the city as well as Evel Knievel jumping the fountains at Caesars Palace. In the modern skyline appears the distinctive outline of The Strip as seen today.

## Owego Elementary School Owego, NY

This new 120,000-square-foot school facility features 35,000 square feet of epoxy terrazzo in seven colors. The sophisticated circular design is accented by 16 gauge aluminum divider strips and a 12-inch high cove base in the main corridor. The aggregate in the terrazzo palette consists of six colors of glass, mother-of-pearl and marble. Four of the seven matrix colors incorporate an innovative walnut shell aggregate that unify the color scheme.

## ***John Cooper School Math and Science Building Woodlands, TX***

The interactive design of this 14,066-square-foot epoxy terrazzo floor in seven colors is installed in the common areas of the school to actively engage students. The entire floor is laid out with divider strips in a graph pattern. Learning tools, represented in terrazzo, include a sine wave, a true-to-scale ruler, a protractor showing the angle of a classroom door, a VEX robotics square and a representation of The Golden Ratio.

This expansion project incorporates 80,000 square feet of epoxy terrazzo. Polished one-inch wide heavy-top zinc divider strips create a visual statement within the massive scale of the open floor design. The project included five precast staircases spanning three levels and two poured-in-place seating platforms. The custom terrazzo base plinth for the fountain art piece includes a removable terrazzo door panel for access to electrical wiring.

## ***Tubman Museum*** ***Macon, GA***

Inspired by a traditional African headdress, the terrazzo is centered on the geometric pattern of the grand central space, showcasing the art on display. The design features five colors of epoxy terrazzo covering 5,000 square feet. Ten thousand linear feet of aluminum strips were bent and cut to size on-site then precisely anchored by hand on the marked slab to complete the design. Each tread and riser of the terrazzo staircase was set to give the appearance of a solid, twisting unit.

## **Welcome Center** **Alabama Department of Transportation** **Mobile, AL**

This delightful project brings to life Gulf Region sea animals. The 8,000-square-foot epoxy installation brings together 34 colors with blends of mother-of-pearl, marble and glass aggregate. To produce the vivid colors for the ten different sea creatures, 100 percent glass aggregate was mixed with colored matrix resins. Each individual aquatic emblem, from the nine-inch shrimp to the 13-foot porpoise, was water-jet cut from aluminum. Three colors of blue were used to depict various depths of water.

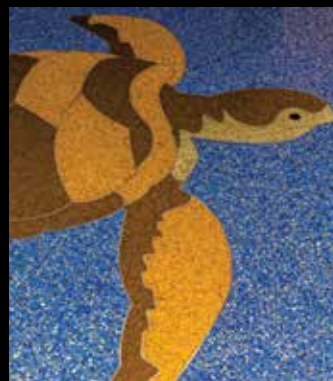

## ***San Manuel Indian Bingo and Casino Highland, CA***

This glitzy 50,000-square-foot installation of epoxy terrazzo reflects the native culture while creating a playful atmosphere. The large recurring patterns play off the geometry of the arrow motif inspired by the casino's dream catcher theme, and run consistently across two stories, through the gambling floor, entrances, food court, bar, walkways and elevated platform to the parking structure. Dream catcher logos in water-jet cut zinc are placed throughout. Glass, mirror, mother-of-pearl and marble aggregate add a consistent sparkle through all nine colors.

This 65,000-square-foot sand-cushion terrazzo installation in a new school is eye catching and functional. Providing ease of maintenance, durability and long-lasting life cycle properties, terrazzo defines all essential requirements of a hard surface floor. Three colors of terrazzo, accented by a red square motif, are pure and consistent. The cement terrazzo utilizes a traditional grid pattern that is formed by one and one-quarter-inch by 16 gauge and back-to-back 16 gauge zinc divider strips.

In this small market store with a full kitchen, approximately 1,000 square feet of terrazzo flooring was installed. Moving up the walls, 700 square feet of terrazzo continues 18 feet to the ceiling. The walls, appearing seamless, consist of precast terrazzo panels fabricated in-shop and installed on-site. A precast terrazzo staircase leads to the basement. Precast terrazzo countertops with backsplash and fascia provide durable, washable, functional surfaces for food preparation.
