

What is Rustic Terrazzo? Custom Options for Exterior Paving



• Cement system typically specified for ongrade outdoor applications.

• Common applications: pool decks, walkways, patios, steps, plazas.

• A textured, nonslip finish resistant to weather conditions.

 Unlike most interior terrazzo installations, rustic is left unground and unpolished.
Installed as a half-inch topping bonded to concrete.

Design

• Custom first impressions adaptable to any architectural style.

• Vast design flexibility, much like terrazzo for interiors.

• A broad scope of variables, from aggregate sizes and matrix colors to the creative use of divider strips.

• An unpolished surface showcases the texture and colors of each stone.

• Classic traditional or artistically complex designs for floor and wall surfaces.

• Can depict most any logo, figure, or pattern.

Compared to Exposed Aggregate Concrete

• A more refined, consistent aesthetic than a concrete finish.

• More options for design and patterns.

Proper maintenance

• Requires annual sealing and caulking.

• De-icing chemicals and salt can damage the surface, so caulk joints instead of metal strips should be used where applicable.

• If water collects around it, freeze-thaw cycles can damage it.

Compatible Terrazzo Systems

• Sand cushion includes a slip sheet to aid in the suppression of reflective cracking, but should not be used in environments where moisture could freeze and cause the underbed to deteriorate.

• Bonded with underbed. should not be used in environments where moisture could freeze and cause the underbed to deteriorate. • Monolithic should be used only in areas where the concrete substrate is stable and not susceptible to cracking.
